

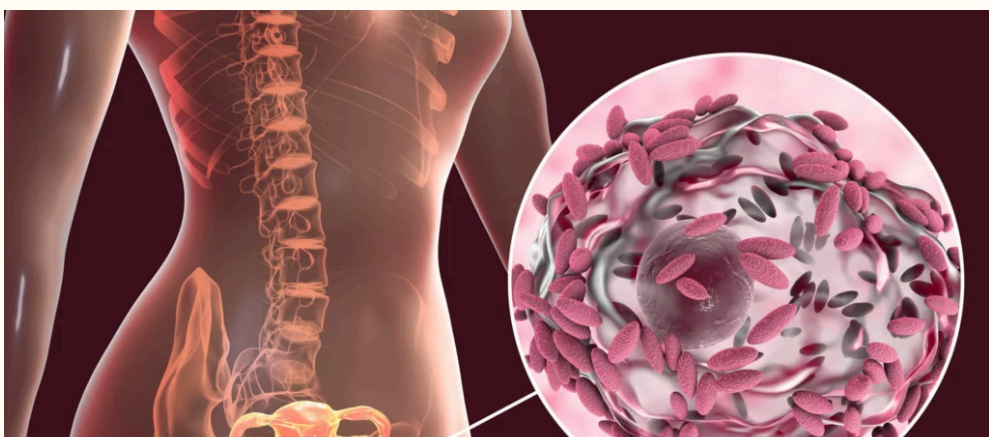
The truth about **BACTERIAL VAGINOSIS**

description Bacterial vaginosis is a common vaginal infection that occurs when there is an imbalance in the vaginal flora, meaning there are more “bad” bacteria than “good” bacteria.

symptoms Light vaginal discharge that can be: gray, white or green, foul vaginal odor like fish, vaginal itching, burning when urinating, symptoms of irritation or redness, but some women have discomfort during sexual intercourse

treatment

Antibiotics such as metronidazole or clindamycin; oral medications: metronidazole (Flagyl), tinidazole (Tindmax), secnidazole (Soloser); vaginal medications: metronidazole gel, clindamycin cream, clindamycin suppositories

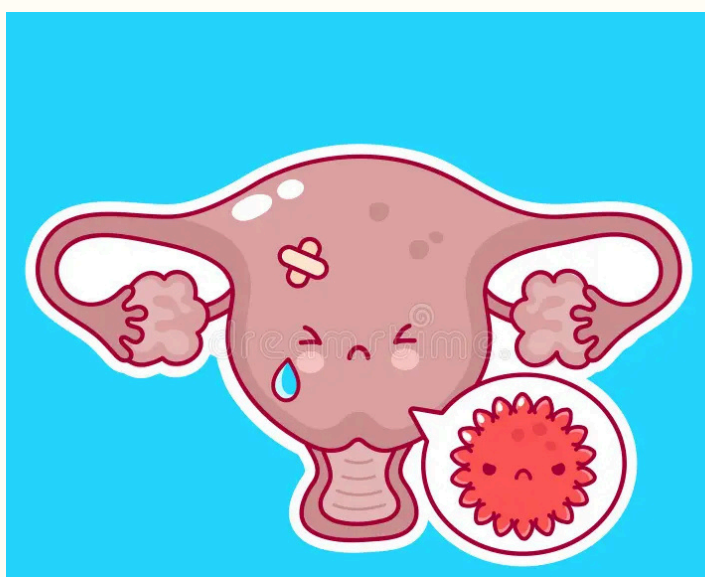
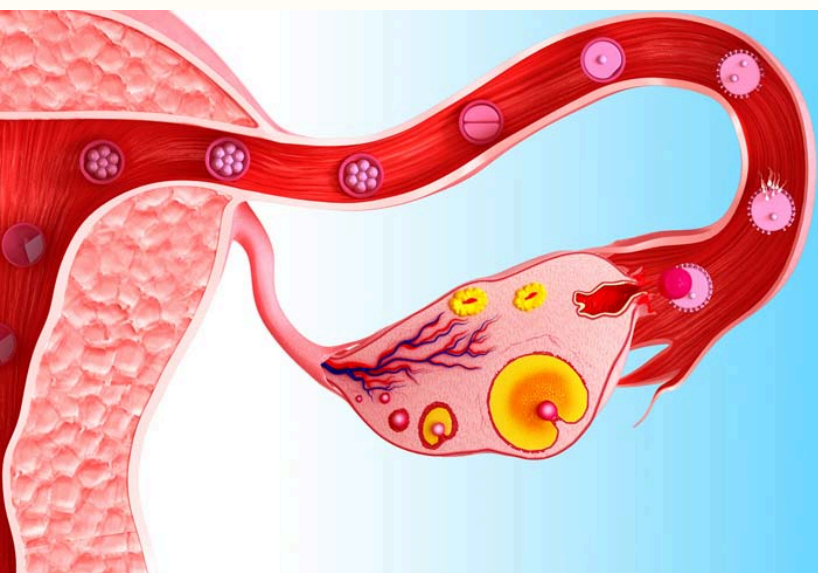


possible complications

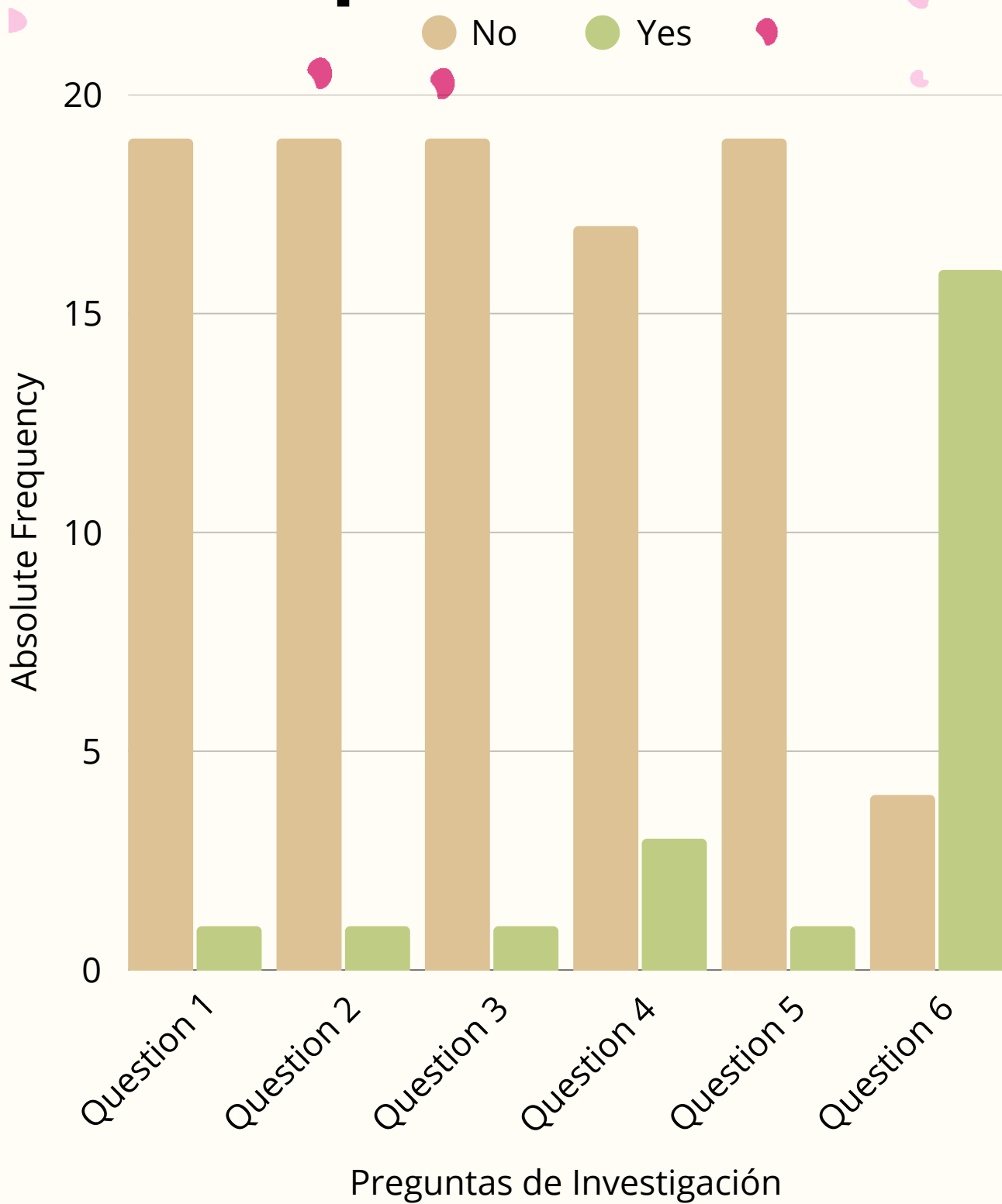
Problems during pregnancy:
Miscarriage, premature labor, prelabor rupture of membranes.
Yellow, green, and foul-smelling vaginal discharge, burning when urinating, itching inside and outside the vagina.

Ways of prevention

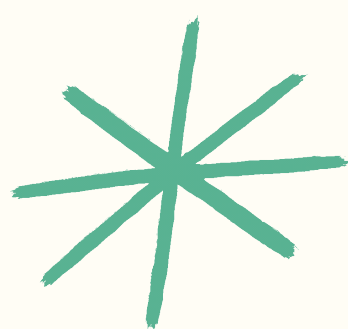
using perfumed products in the genital area, do not douche, maintain safe sex (using condoms or limiting the number of sexual

Question 1: Do you know any symptoms of bacterial vaginosis?

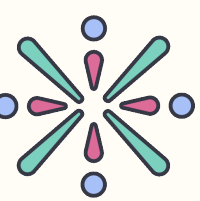
In question 2, 9 people said yes and 15 said no to the following question: Do you know what bacterial vaginosis is?
